In-text citation - 3 options:

- Blah blah blah blah blah blah (Author number).
- According to Author blah blah blah (number).
- “Blah blah blah blah blah,” said Author (number).

Where “number” is the page number or paragraph number, if applicable. If no Author, then use Title, e.g., Blah blah blah (“Title”).

Citations in the **Works Cited** list should include these **elements** in this order (where applicable)

CONTAINER

1 Author.	Who created the work?
2 Title of Source.	What is the name of the work?
3 Title of Container,	Where - Larger wholes in which the source is located
4 Contributor,	Editors, illustrators, translators, etc
5 Version,	Edition or version of a work
6 Number,	Part of sequence, volume and/or issue
7 Publisher,	Who produced or distributed the work?
8 Publication Date,	When was it created?
9 Location.	Where found? Page / paragraph number, URL or DOI (incl. http(s)://)
& IBO Access Date.	When found? Important if source may change.
